

Knowledge Coordinators Workshop

RCSA hosted the first regional Knowledge Coordinators Workshop, March 1-3, 2004, in Gaborone, Botswana. The [Agency's Knowledge for Development \(KfD\) Strategy](#) seeks to get the



right knowledge to the right people at the right time. KfD activities are being designed to tap the vast knowledge and experience both inside the Agency and in outside sources. Innovative tools and practices are being explored to bring about changes in the way knowledge is used, reused, and shared to improve productivity, efficiency, and decision-making.

Knowledge Coordinators from the RCSA, REDSO/ESA and USAID missions in Malawi, Mozambique, South Africa, and Namibia, and Zambia attended the Workshop. Knowledge Coordinators are the lead advocate in each mission for

knowledge activities - using knowledge management tools and methods to allow their mission to better harness and use the wealth of knowledge generated within missions, the Agency, and by our implementing partners, to achieve development results. During the Workshop, Knowledge Coordinators organized a [Community of Practice](#) to support knowledge sharing on implementing KFD practices and tools at their missions. The Workshop was organized by [Susan Wallace](#) from the USAID Bureau of Policy & Program Coordination and conducted by Joe Rabenstine and Judy Light, with support from Matt Sattah.
