OPERATION DAY'S WORK:

...is designed to reach American youth where they live and learn. Operation Day's Work engages them in community service and international affairs in partnership with the U.S. government's Agency for International Development (USAID). This year, American students will be performing sponsored, community service projects to improve their neighborhoods AND to raise funds for the education of desperately poor children in Haiti. The Quincy students will not only be helping their own communities but they will also be helping nations as well.

PROJECT INFORMATION :

An individual or group (suggested) community service project is designed by students to be completed on or before April 17th.

Each project can be anything the student(s) wishes, whether it be to read to children or paint a wall. Sponsors pledge any amount or \$5.25 (minimum wage) for each hour of completed community service.

ALL monies raised go to the education project in Haiti selected by the students which will educate 2,000 Haitian youth over 5 years. The Haitian education project is in collaboration with CARE and the World Concern Development Organization.

GOALS :

The goal of this year's Operation Day's Work is for Quincy students to work with the five other pilot schools to do community service to raise the \$30,000 needed to launch and sustain the education project chosen.

The other 5 schools are in : Grand Forks, ND ; Washington, DC ; Thetford, VT ; Minneapolis, MN ; and Milwaukee, WI . Each city is raising \$5,000.

The other goal is to establish Operation Day's Work USA as a student run program in every state nationwide by 2003.
